Australian Consumer Data Sharing Regime – Lessons for Switzerland?

Open Banking is increasingly popular globally and is generally understood as the right of consumers to share their banking data with third parties of their choice so these can offer a better value for money service. While the EU and UK pioneered the development of Open Banking, Australia has adopted it and applied the concept of consumer data portability far more broadly. Its Consumer Data Right (CDR) regime, introduced in 2019, is unique in its intention to implement economy-wide data sharing across banking, energy, telecommunications, pensions, insurance, groceries, health, and other sectors. Although the legal frameworks are in a state of flux, the presenter analyses what Switzerland can learn from Australia's experience with its CDR regime to date.
